

BE PREPARED: A CERTain Way to Be Prepared

THE EYES OF THE WORLD WILL BE ON LOS ANGELES Sunday as stars gather for the Oscars a few miles away in Hollywood. But a program created in L.A. nearly 40 years ago deserves an award for its starring role in preparing residents nationwide to be disaster first responders as members of <u>Community Emergency Response Teams</u>, or CERT.

Longtime Franklin Hills resident Roland Giedraitis completed the in-person CERT training course last month for the second time. He was one of the early participants at CERT training, and various refresher courses and handson drills, scheduled shortly after the FHRA was founded and very well attended.

"I took the CERT course more than 20 years ago since I wanted to be better prepared for an earthquake or some other disaster," Giedraitis explained. "I took the course again simply because it's easy to forget the details. This is an excellent review which instills in me greater confidence to cope with any upcoming disasters," he added.

At that time, more than 50 Franklin Hills residents participated in two CERT trainings and the subject was covered extensively in our <u>early Overviews</u>.
